## **Our History**

Union Uni ersit is an heir of three antebell m Tennessee schools West Tennessee College and its predecessor, Jackson Male Academ , both located at Jackson, and of Union Uni ersit , located at M rfreesboro and it is the inheritor of another college in 1927, Hall-Mood J nior College of Martin, Tennessee.

Jackson Male Academ , fo nded in 1823 shortl after the opening of West Tennessee for settlement, as chartered b the legislat re in 1825.

West Tennessee College originated in the mid-1840s hen s pporters of the Academ sec red a charter for a college and recei ed an endo ment from the state to come from the sale of p blic lands. Under its charter, the propert rights and go ernance of the Jackson Male Academ ere ested in the tr stees of the College. The College offered three degrees bachelor of arts, bachelor of philosoph , and master of arts and had for departments: Moral Philosoph , Lang ages, Mathematics, and Nat ral Philosoph and Chemistr .

West Tennessee College contin ed ntil 1874, hen at a time of depressed economic conditions, the tr stees offered the College's b ildings, gro nds, and endo ment to Tennessee Baptists in the hopes of attracting the so the estern regional ni ersit planned b the state's Baptist leaders.

Mean hile, after ears of disc ssion and the raising of an endo ment, the Baptists of Middle Tennessee (there ere three separate con entions in Tennessee at that time) in 1848 established Union Uni ersit in M rfreesboro, near the geographical center of the state. Union Uni ersit came pon hard times hen in 1859 its highl respected president, Joseph H. Eaton, died and hen d ring the Ci il War its
